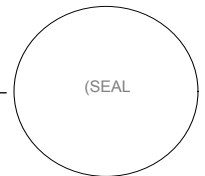

The Declaration must be made before a Registrar, Justice of the Peace Commissioner of Oaths, or any other person authorized by law to administer oaths in the Province or Territory wherein the Declaration is made.

In the case of a corporation, this Declaration must be made by an officer of the corporation authorized by company resolution or by affixing the seal of the corporation on this form.

In the case of an Indian Band, this Declaration must be made by person(s) authorized by Band Council Resolution.

The information you provide on this form is collected by Transport Canada for the purpose of registering your vessel. It is collected under the authority of section 43 of the **Canada Shipping Act, 2001**. The registration of your non-pleasure (commercial) craft is mandatory unless it is registered in a foreign state. The information will be held in the Department's Personal Information Bank entitled Canadian Register of Vessels (bank number TC PPU 041). The information will be retained for 5 years after vessel is deregistered then destroyed. Your information will be handled in accordance with the provisions of the **Privacy Act**. Please note that under section 76 of the **Canada Shipping Act, 2001**, a person may examine or obtain copies of any entries in the Register with respect to a vessel.
